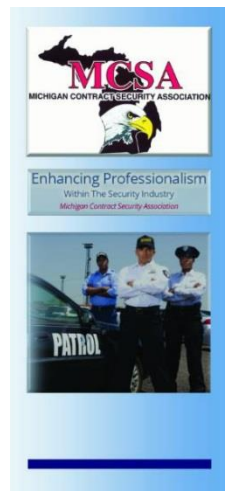

Richard DesLauriers entered on duty as a Special Agent with the FBI in January 1987. Upon completion of training at the

FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia, he was assigned to the Birmingham Division where he worked violent crime and fugitive matters, and then began his career in

Counterintelligence. He was transferred to the New York Office in December 1990, where he continued to work Counterintelligence matters.

Senate Bills 161, 162, 163 and 164 still pending:

The MCSA bills for re-write of the Security Guard Licensing statutes are still pending in the House Committee on Regulatory Reform. Senator Booher's office and the staff at Julian Vail, LLC have been in contact with Chairman of the Regulatory Reform Committee, Representative Ray Franz, to obtain a date for committee hearing. As of this time, no committee hearing is scheduled, however, we expect a hearing this fall to move the bills to the House Floor for final passage. Patience is a virtue at this point, as many meetings and discussion with dissenting opinions have been held to work out a compromise.

MCSA members may want to schedule again to visit the Capitol and meet with Representatives to encourage their support for our bills.

Presently, the rules affecting the Private Security Business industry under PA-330 remain outdated and seriously flawed with respect to public safety, public trust, and the duties that security guards and security guard agencies are employed to perform.

A few points of the agreed upon language include:

- Requiring a mandatory minimum training for any individual seeking employment by a security guard agency that will provide security services for others. Such training needs to be required and provided by the security guard agency. The training will also need to be standardized and documented.
- Allowing an individual working as a security guard to carry a firearm, any commercially available baton, a chemical spray device, a taser, or restraint device with specialized training from the manufacturer.
- Allowing the use of firearms and less than lethal alternatives that are declared essential for security personnel.

Background and employment Fingerprinting

You have already been notified that the Federal agencies will not allow MCSA or any other investigative agency to submit fingerprints to them for background checks. You will notice that in the proposed legislation that I-chat is recommended for background checks. Senator Rick Jones has been in contact with Julian Vail, LLC in regards to the Federal opinion that only law enforcement may utilize fingerprints. We continue to work on this with the Senator and Congress persons in Washington, DC to attempt to further a better outcome for all security guard agencies.

Headquarters in Washington, D.C.

In December, 1997, Mr. DesLauriers transferred to the Boston Division where he supervised Counterintelligence investigations and served as the division's Counterintelligence Program Coordinator. Mr. DesLauriers was designated an Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Boston Division in 2003, overseeing the Counterintelligence Program as well as the division's Administrative programs.

Mr. DesLauriers was promoted to Section Chief of the Global Section, Counterintelligence Division, in February, 2005. In this capacity he was responsible for national program management of counterintelligence and espionage investigations. In April 2006, he was designated as Special Agent in Charge of the Counterintelligence Division in the New York Office. In March 2008, Mr. DesLauriers served as Deputy Assistant Director of the Counterintelligence Division at FBI Headquarters, where he was responsible for FBI counterintelligence operations and espionage investigations nationwide.

In July 2010, Mr. DesLauriers was designated the Special Agent in Charge of the FBI's Boston Field Division, which is the agency's 10th largest office and covers Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island. In this position, he leads a cadre of over 550 FBI Agents, Intelligence Analysts, and Professional Support personnel responsible for the investigation of terrorism, espionage, and criminal matters in this geographic region.

During his FBI career, Mr. DesLauriers was a member of the leadership team which in 2010 arrested and prosecuted a Russian spy network which had operated covertly inside the United States for over a decade

New Injury Reporting Requirements

On September 1, 2015, MIOSHA implemented the new injury reporting requirements in response to the changes federal OSHA made effective January 1, 2015. Employers in the state of Michigan will be required to report any work-related amputation, loss of an eye, or in-patient hospitalization of any employee, within 24 hours of the incident. Currently, employers must report the work-related in-patient hospitalization of three or more employees.

Employers can go to the MIOSHA Recordkeeping [website](#) to report an in-patient hospitalization, amputation, or loss of an eye incident or call the new injury report line: 844-464-6742. This system should NOT be used for reporting work related fatalities. All work-related fatalities must still be reported within eight hours to the current fatality line: 800-858-0397.

U.S. Hackers Breach Security of HealthCare.gov

WASHINGTON - Hackers breached security at the website of the government's health insurance marketplace, HealthCare.gov, but did not steal any personal information on consumers, Obama administration officials said Thursday.

The administration informed Congress of the violation, which it described as "an intrusion on a test server" supporting the website.

"Our review indicates that the server did not contain consumer personal information, data was not transmitted outside the agency and the website was not specifically targeted," said Aaron Albright, a spokesman at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, which runs the website. "We have taken measures to further strengthen security."

Mr. Albright said the hacking was made possible by several security weaknesses. The test server should not have been connected to the Internet, he said, and it came from the manufacturer with a default password that had not been changed.
